AVERAGE ANNUAL FAMILY INCOME AND EXPENDITURE IN AURORA: 2023

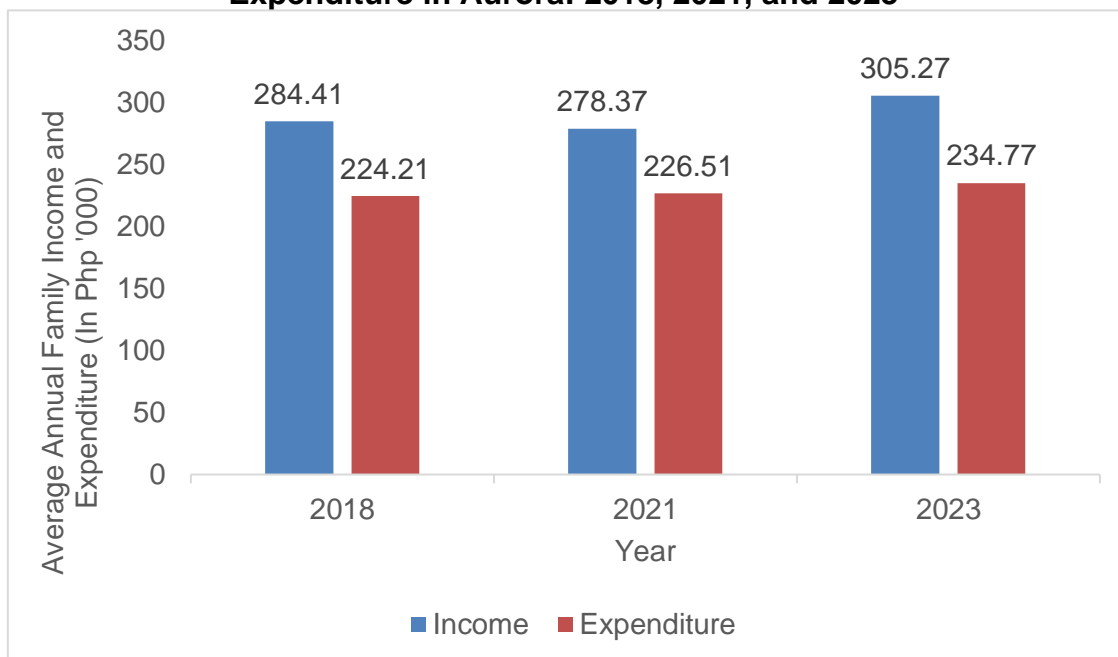

Average Annual Family Income and Annual Family Expenditure in Aurora increase by 9.7 percent and 3.7 percent, respectively, in 2023

The average yearly income of Filipino families in Aurora was estimated at Php 305.27 thousand in 2023, a 9.7 percent increase from its value of Php278.37 thousand in 2021. Furthermore, Php 284.41 thousand was reported as the average yearly family income in the province in 2018. (Figure 1 and Table 1)

Meanwhile, Filipino households in Aurora spent a total of Php 234.77 thousand on average in 2023—a 3.7 percent rise from Php 226.51 thousand in 2021. The average yearly family budget for 2018 was recorded as Php 224.21 thousand. (Figure 1 and Table 1)

In addition to this, Central Luzon recorded the third-highest both in average annual family income and average annual expenditure in the country at Php 375.24 thousand and Php 298.7 thousand, respectively, in 2023. (Table 2)

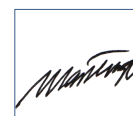

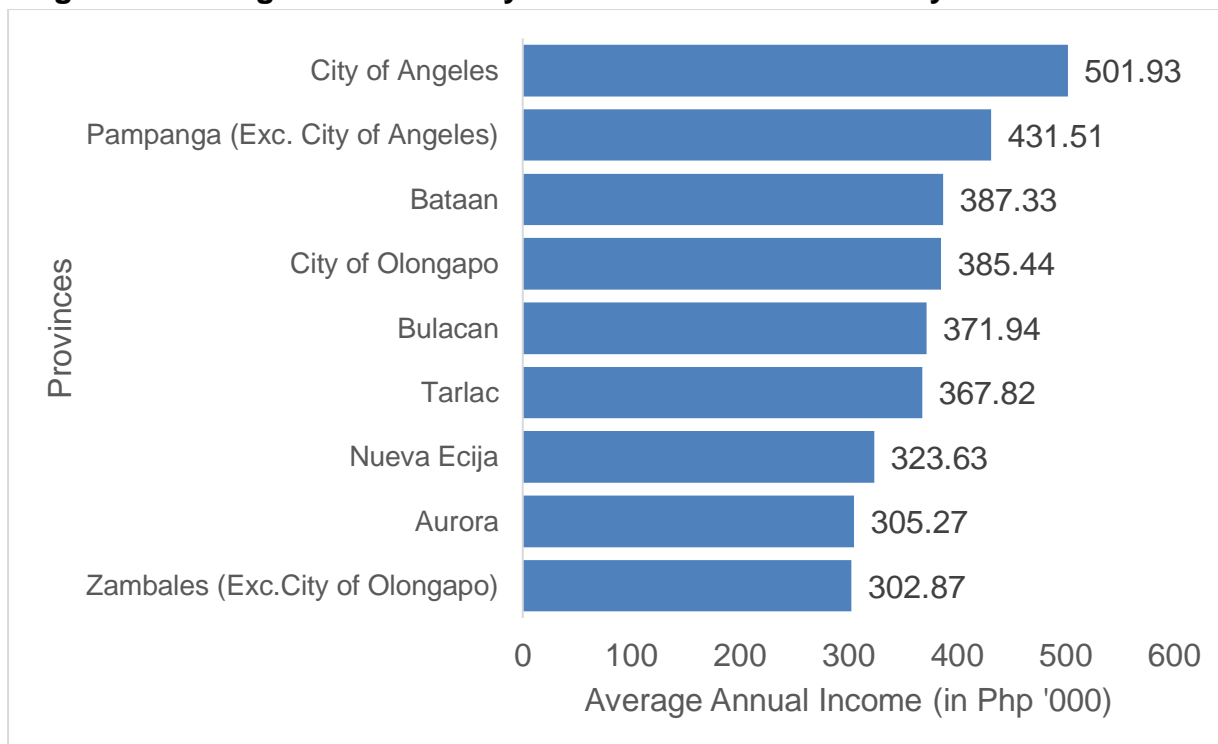

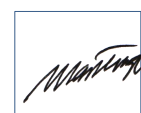
Meanwhile, among the provinces in Central Luzon, Aurora registered average annual family income of Php 305.27 thousand which was second to the lowest in the region during the reference period. On the other hand, the City of Angeles registered the highest average family income at Php 501.93 thousand and followed by Pampanga and Bataan while Zambales recorded the lowest. (Figure 2)

Figure 2. Average Annual Family Income in Central Luzon by Province: 2023^P

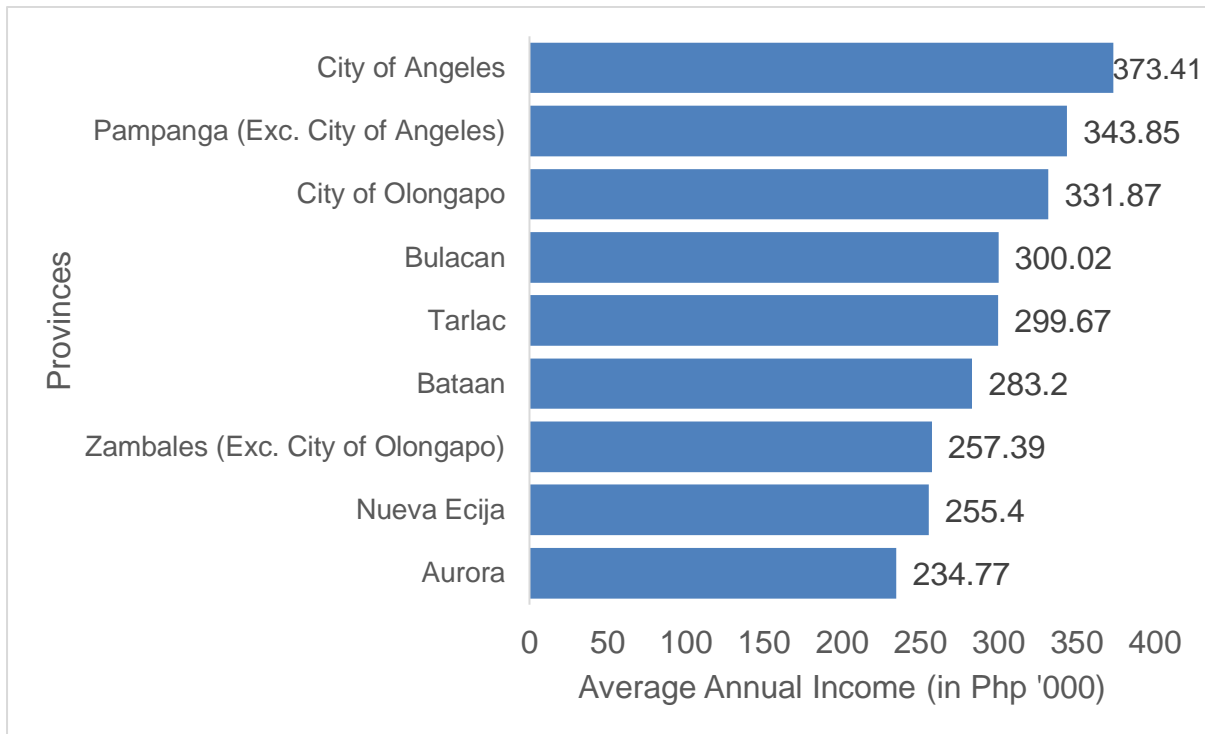


Among the provinces in Central Luzon, Aurora registered the lowest average annual family expenditure at Php 234.77 thousand in 2023. On the other hand, aside from having the highest annual family income, the City of Angeles also posted the highest in terms of average family expenditure at Php 373.41 thousand. It was followed by Pampanga with Php 343.85 and City of Olongapo with 331.47 thousand. (Figure 3)

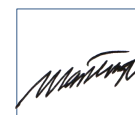

TECHNICAL NOTES

2023 Family Income and Expenditure Survey

The Family Income and Expenditure Survey (FIES), a survey being undertaken by the Philippine Statistics Authority (PSA) across the country, is the main source of data on family income and expenditure in the Philippines. It aims to accomplish the following:

- to gather data on family income, sources of income, family expenditure, and relate information affecting family income and expenditure levels and patterns in the Philippines;
- to determine the income distribution, levels of living and spending patterns, and the degree of inequality among families;
- to provide benchmark information to update the weights used in the estimation of the Consumer Price Index; and
- to provide inputs in the estimation of the country's poverty threshold and incidence.

DEFINITION OF TERMS

Entrepreneurial Activity – any economic activity, business or enterprise, whether in agriculture or in non-agriculture sector, engaged in by any member of the family an operator or as self-employed.

Family Expenditures – expenses or disbursements made by the family purely for personal consumption during the calendar year 2023. These exclude all expenses in relation to farm or business operations, investment ventures, purchase of real property and other disbursements which do not involve personal consumption.

Family Income – includes primary income and receipts from other sources received by all members during the reference period, as participants in any economic activity or as recipients of transfers, pensions or grants.

Family Size – total number of family members enumerated.


Family Sustenance Activity – family activity but unlike an entrepreneurial activity, the produce is mainly for home consumption.

Food Consumption – it covers the actual consumption (not expenditure) of the family during the reference period. It included food consumed at home and food regularly consumed outside the home.

Household Head – an adult member of the household who is responsible for the care and organization of the household, or the one who is regarded as such by the members of the household.

Housing, Water, Electricity, Gas and Other Fuels - refers to the total family expenses for actual and imputed rentals of housing and consumption of water, electricity, gas and other fuels during the reference period.

Imputed Rent of Owner-Occupied Dwelling Unit – the estimated amount that the owner of a dwelling unit would charge if he/she was to rent his/her entire dwelling unit monthly, unfurnished and excluding the costs of utilities.




Main Source of Income – source from which most of the income of the family is obtained.

Net Share of Crops, Fruits and Vegetables Produced, Aquaculture Products Harvested or Livestock and Poultry Raised by Other Households – refers to the share of harvested crops, fruits, vegetables, aquaculture products and others received by the household from tenants, or a fixed rent or any amount out of the produce received from tenants during the reference period.

Received as Gifts – includes all food and non-food items received in kind by the family during the reference period.

Salaries and Wages from Employment – includes all forms of compensation, whether in cash or in kind, and those received by family members who are regular or occasional/seasonal workers in agricultural and non-agricultural industries.

Taxes – it includes income tax, real estate tax and other direct taxes.
