

PSO NUEVA ECIJA DISSEMINATES THE RESULT OF THE FIRST PRODUCT ACCOUNTS COMPILATION OF THE PROVINCE

As PSO Nueva Ecija shares the results of the 2018–2022 Provincial Product Accounts Compilation with the province and its stakeholders, the office headed by Engr. Elizabeth M. Rayo conducted the first PPA Dissemination Forum at Hotel Consuelo, Sta. Rosa, Nueva Ecija, on December 12, 2023.

Hand-in-hand, the PSO, the regional office, the central office, the PPA, and the whole product accounts division of PSA aimed to present the share of the province based on major sectors, industries, and its contributors; and the interventions of the government to further support the economy. These aims were attained through the dissemination of CSS Rayo and the statement of Engr. Dennis C. Agtay, the Provincial Planning Development Coordinator.

The event was attended by stakeholders, including LGU representatives from the Municipal/City Planning Development Office, the Business and Permit Licensing Office, and officers from the Provincial Government of Nueva Ecija, such

as the Provincial Planning Development Office itself, headed by Engr. Agtay and the Office of the Provincial Agriculturist, headed by Dr. Jovita B. Agliam. The attendance and involvement of Dr. Richard Simangan, Provincial Director of the Department of Trade and Industry, was also evident in the forum.

In the open forum, representatives from LGUs and media partners expressed their questions which were later answered by CSS Rayo, PPDC Agtay, SOCD RSSOIII CSS Arlene Z. Torrico, and the focal persons from the central office.

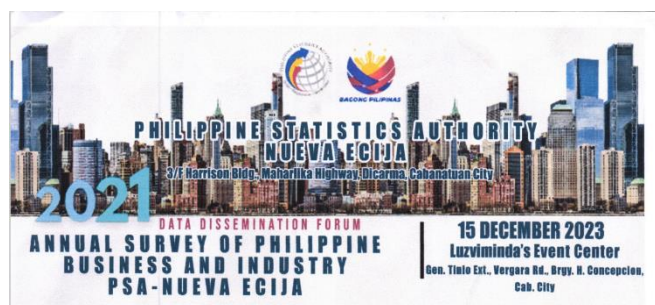


The forum serves as the highlight of the program, where the stakeholders and media partners commended PPDC Agtay's interventions based on PPA results, while Dr. Agliam of OPA generously expressed her gratitude and commendations to PSA and its data, especially PPA. She also mentioned the importance of this event and the importance of the results from the PPA Compilation. The dissemination forum adjourned through SrSS Rommel L. Payawal, who conveyed his gratitude to the attendees, stakeholders, and officials within the province. He affirmed the efforts of the whole PPA team, who did their best despite the challenges that came along with being a "first-timer" in product accounts, yet were able to surpass them all and come up with a dissemination forum.



2021 ANNUAL SURVEY OF PHILIPPINE BUSINESS AND INDUSTRY (ASPBI) DATA DISSEMINATION FORUM

PSO Nueva Ecija holds the 2021 Annual Survey of Philippine Business and Industry (ASPBI) Regional Data Dissemination Forum following the release of the survey results sometime in October 2023. The survey was conducted in April-July 2022 after a year the declaration of global pandemic due to Covid – 19 virus, along with its rider survey, the 2021 Survey on Information and Communications Technology. The half-day program

was held at Luzviminda's Event Center in Cabanatuan City on December 15, 2023.

At the start of the program Chief Statistical Specialist Elizabeth M. Rayo welcomed guests and delivered a simple but meaningful message, thanking respondents in their continuous cooperation by accommodating our survey questionnaires not only those conducted quarterly (QSPBD and annually (ASPBI but also those other establishment-based surveys of the PSA. She acknowledged their timely submission of questionnaires and those establishments responding through online platforms.

After the Audio-Visual Presentation on the ASPBI background, SS II Jonabel C. Yu presented the

regional data of ASPBI for Central Luzon starting from the number of establishments, total employment, average annual compensation, total revenue, total expense and the total sales from e-commerce transactions. Data were disaggregated by regional level, broad industry group and by employment size (MSMES). The data presented were extracted from the national data of the 2021 ASPBI results whereas the regional level for Central Luzon was generated. Consistently on top 4 regions, Central Luzon was among the region with highest percentage share at the national level led by the National Capital Region along with CALABARZON and Visayas Region.

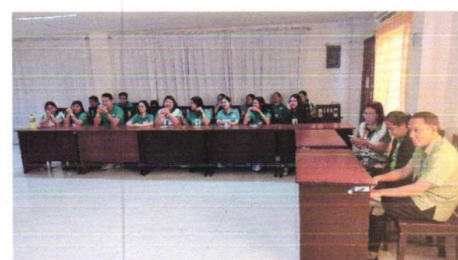

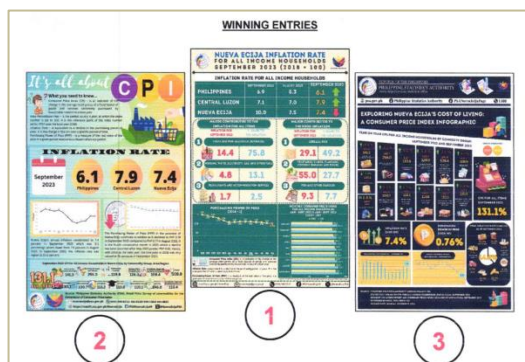

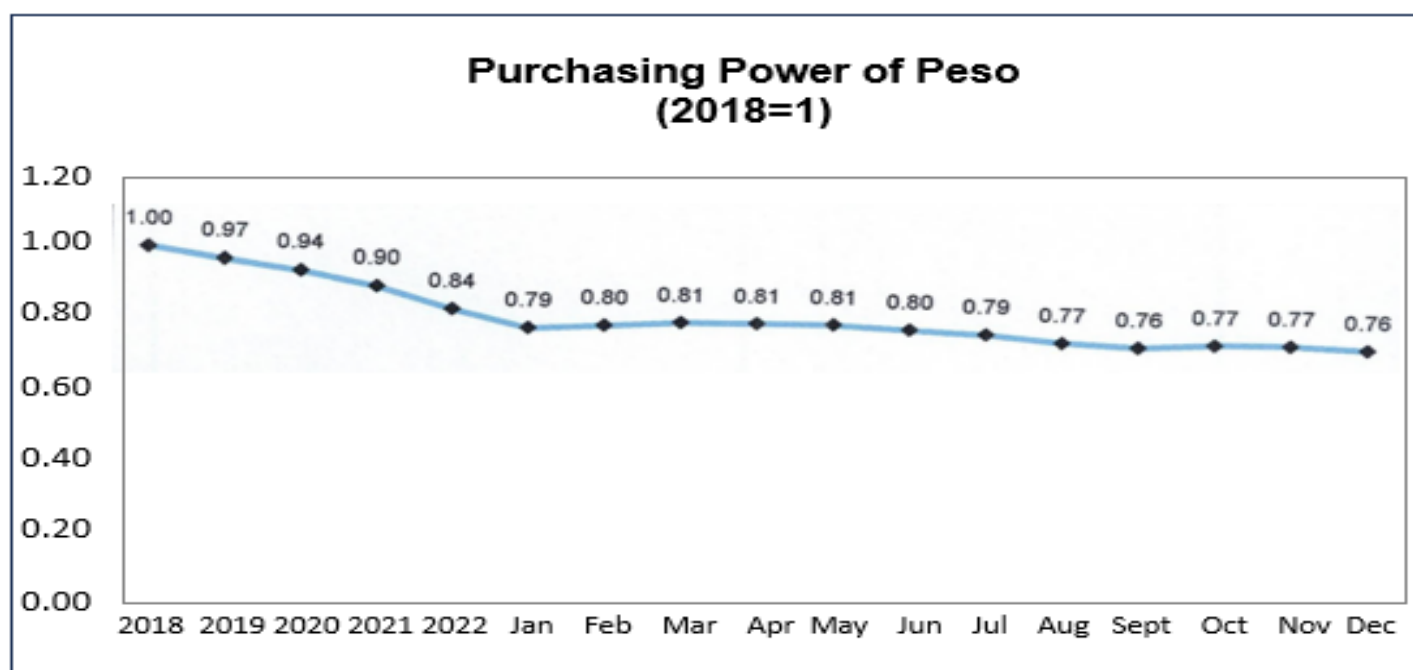

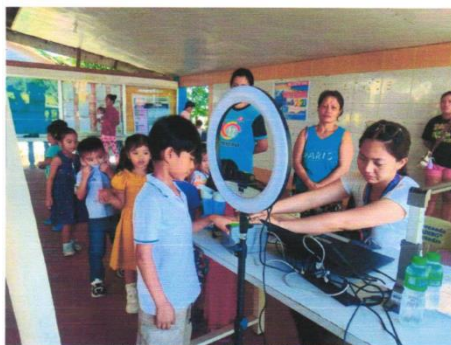


Coordination to School Heads

PSO Nueva Ecija – PhilSys committed registration teams are actively involved in coordinating mobile and institutional registration initiatives to strengthen and enhance our registration database.

One of the directives from the Central office is the coordination and co-location registration of students throughout school division of Nueva Ecija. The PhilSys team coordinated to the School Principals to schedule a conduct of Step-2 Registration for the unregistered students in their school.

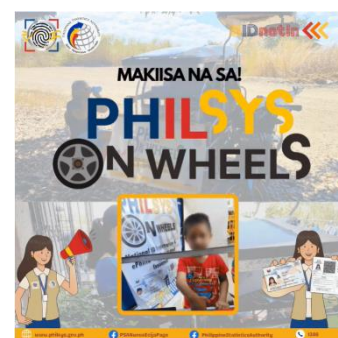
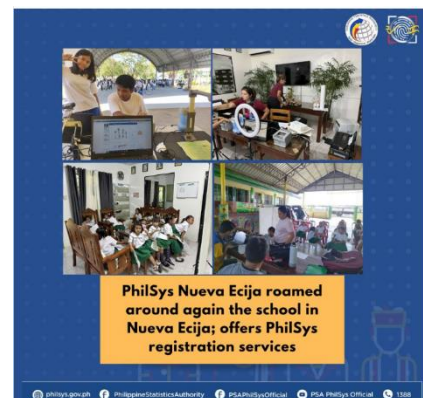
As of now, PSO Nueva Ecija have already registered approximately 87% of the target registrants. However, as PSO gear towards reaching 100% registration, it became more challenging for PhilSys to locate the remaining 13% of the population. Teams are now in the process of saturating those unregistered individuals through mobile and institutional registration throughout the province.

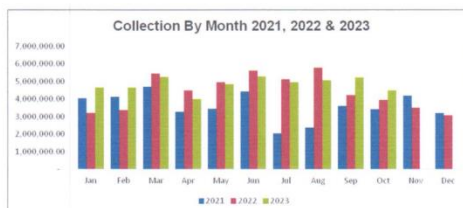

The PSA - Nueva Ecija provincial office undertook the following activities for the month of October 2023

CRS outlet – A total of 25,339 applications were processed for the month of October, with a total collection of 4,486,650.00. An average of 1,206 per day requested for authenticated documents in security paper. Out of the 25,339 applications 745 were for electronic endorsement and 3,772 were for Cenomar.

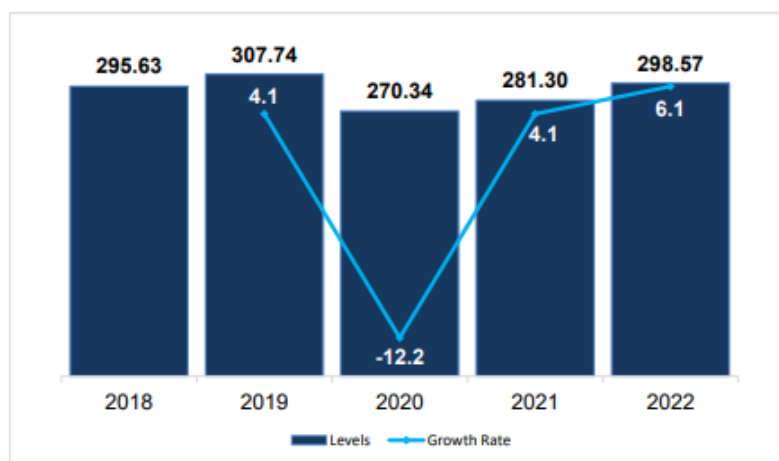

Nueva Ecija Economy Registers 6.1 Percent Growth in 2022

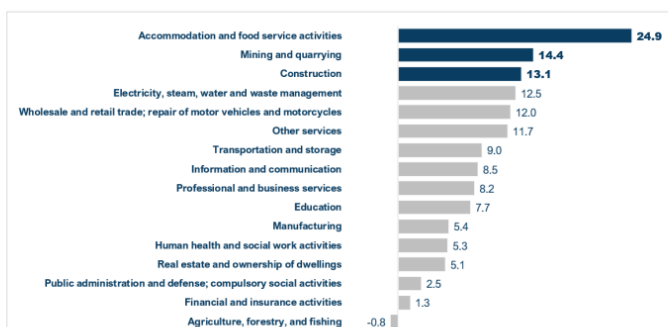
Figure 1. Annual GDP of Nueva Ecija, 2018 to 2022

The economy of Nueva Ecija posted a growth of 6.1 percent in 2022, accelerated from the 4.1 percent growth in the previous year. The Gross Domestic Product (GDP) of the province was valued at PhP 298.57 billion in 2022, lower by 2.98 percent compared to the 2019 pre-pandemic GDP level. (Figure 1)

In 2022, Accommodation and food service activities grew the fastest with 24.9 percent. This was followed by Mining and quarrying and Construction with 14.4 percent and 13.1 percent, respectively. (Figure 2)

2021 to 2022

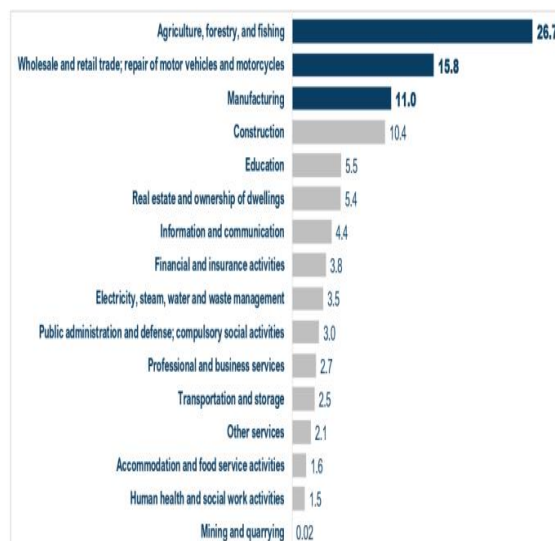

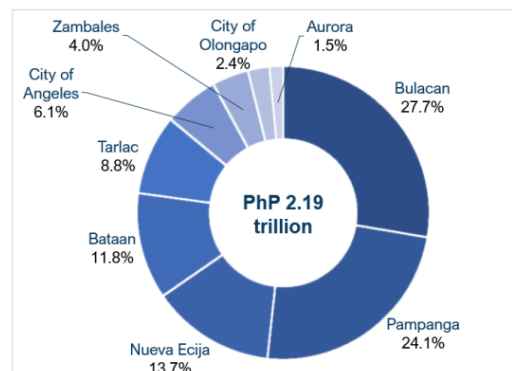
Figure 3. Percent Share of Industries to GDP of Nueva Ecija,

In terms of share, Agriculture, forestry, and fishing, Wholesale and retail trade; repair of motor vehicles and motorcycles, and Manufacturing when combined already contributed more than half of the economy of the province in 2022. (Figure 3)

Nueva Ecija had the third biggest economy among the seven provinces and two Highly Urbanized Cities (HUCs) in Central Luzon. It accounted for about 13.7 percent of the PhP 2.19 trillion Gross Regional Domestic Product of the region in 2022. (Figure 4)

The Philippine Statistics Authority (PSA) established through Republic Act No. 10625, otherwise known as the Philippine Statistical Act of 2013, is tasked, among others, to compile and maintain macroeconomic accounts and indicators, at the national and subnational levels.

The Provincial Product Accounts or PPA has been the mechanism of the PSA to compile the annual estimates of Gross Domestic Product by province/HUC, consistent with the Regional and National Accounts of the Philippines. In 2023, Central Luzon was one of the seven additional pilot regions to implement the PPA, marking another expansion since the inception of the PPA in 2021.

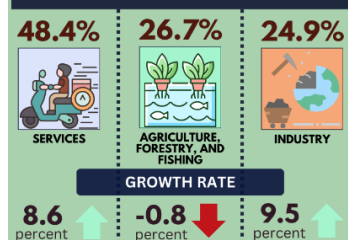
The Provincial Product Accounts (PPA) is a mechanism to compile the Gross Domestic Product (GDP) using production approach and other economic accounts at the subregional level.

GDP at the provincial level determines how fast the province is growing; compare the economy of the province with other provinces; and identify the growing and slowing industries.

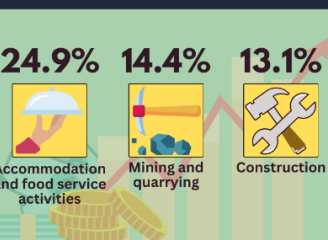
GROSS DOMESTIC PRODUCT OF NUEVA ECIJA



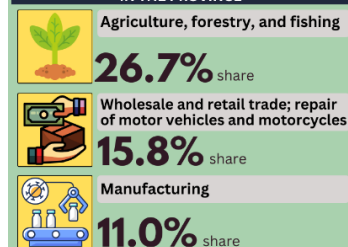
SHARE OF MAJOR INDUSTRIES TO ECONOMY



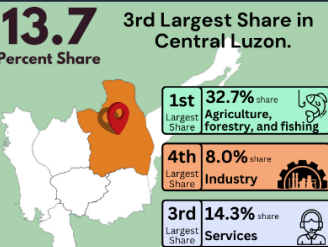
FASTEST GROWING INDUSTRIES IN 2022

PERFORMANCE OF NUEVA ECIJA IN THE REGION



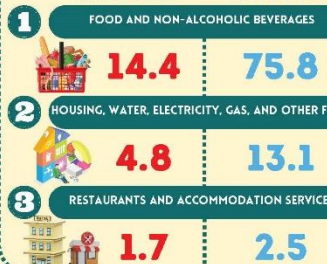

NUEVA ECIJA INFLATION RATE FOR ALL INCOME HOUSEHOLDS SEPTEMBER 2023 (2018 = 100)

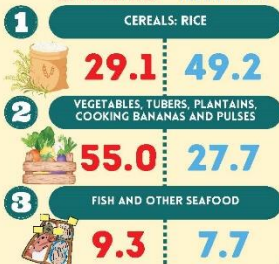

This translates an increase in the value of the Gross Domestic Product (GDP) from PhP 281.30 billion in 2021 to PhP 298.57 billion in 2022.

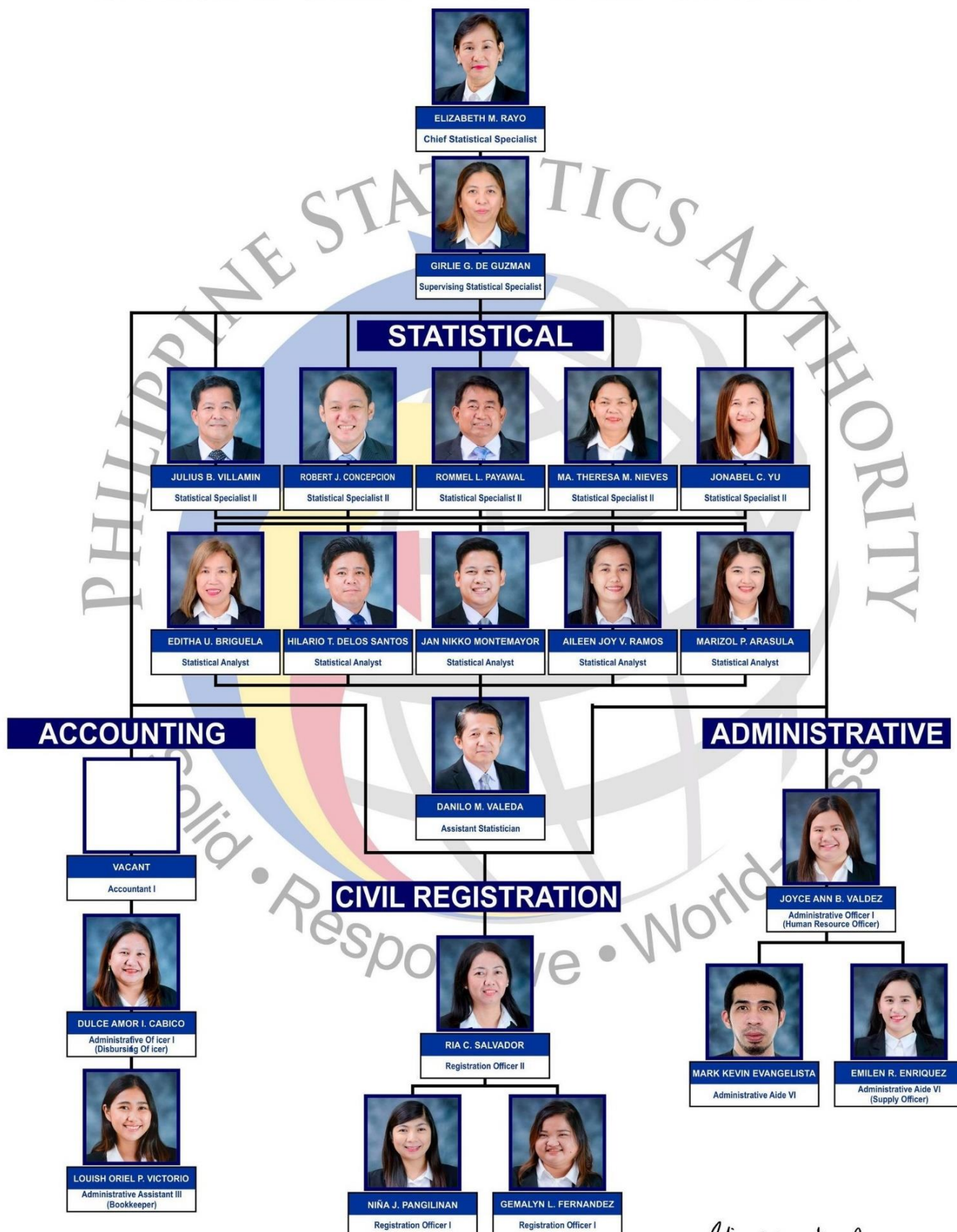
