### Monthly Inflation Report Keeps Bulacan **Informed Month**

he Philippine Statistics Authority (PSA) Bulacan presented the province's March 2025 inflation report during its monthly press conference on April 14, 2025 at 10 a.m. The conference was held online via Google Meet and streamed live on social media, providing real-time updates to the public.

According to the report, Bulacan's inflation rate remained steady at 2.0% in March 2025, showing no change from the previous month. This marks a significant improvement compared to the 7.7% inflation rate recorded in March 2024, reflecting a continued easing of price increases over the past year. The steady inflation rate indicates a positive shift in the local economy, which has been experiencing gradual price stabilization.

Key contributors to the inflation rate in March 2025 included food and non-alcoholic beverages, alcoholic beverages and tobacco, and housing, water, electricity, gas, and other fuels. These sectors saw notable price movements, which played a major role in the overall inflation figure.

The monthly briefing was attended by various stakeholders from across the province, including local officials and representatives from different sectors. It serves to keep the public and key groups informed about current price trends and their impact on the local economy and household spending.

### Annual Medical Examination at **PSA Bulacan**

2025, the Philippine Statistics On 2 April Authority (PSA) Bulacan conducted its annual medical examination, with 25 employees having participated in the activity. The examination covered Urinalysis, ECG, Blood Pressure, Weight, Height, and Blood Chemistry tests.

After the medical activities, a health forum was conducted, led by Dr. Jocelyn E. Tamayo of Prime Medical Laboratory, who discussed blood chemistry and related health conditions. The session concluded with an open forum, allowing staff to raise health-related concerns and receive expert advice.

### **PhilSys Registration Reaches Seniors**

PhilSys Bulacan continued its efforts to bring the National ID registration closer to the community by conducting mobile registration activities in local municipalities.

On 22 April 2025, the team visited the Office of the Senior Citizen Affairs (OSCA) in Balagtas, where 131 individuals were successfully registered. This was followed by another registration on April 25 at the OSCA in Pandi, accommodating 130 senior citizens.

The initiative aims to ensure that elderly residents have easy access to government services through the National ID.

### **Bulacan Takes Part in Nationwide Labor** Force Survey for 2025 April

The Philippine Statistics Authority (PSA) - Bulacan successfully conducted the April 2025 Labor Force Survey (LFS) with Rider Questions on Tourism Employment from 8 to 30 April 2025. The survey aimed to gather data on the country's employment situation and assess the alignment of the Philippine workforce's skills with labor market demands.

A total of seven Statistical Researchers were deployed to cover 395 sample households across selected municipalities, including Hagonoy, Doña Remedios Trinidad,, Plaridel, Guiguinto, Marilao, San Ildefonso, San Rafael, Angat, and cities of Malolos, San Jose del Monte, Meycauayan, and Baliuag. The selected areas ensured a representative distribution of data across the province.
