PSA ZAMBALES EXCEED NATIONAL ID REGISTRATION FOR APRIL 2025

The National ID registration efforts in the province of Zambales and Olongapo City have significantly surpassed expectations for the month of April 2025, according to the latest data. A total of 1,267 individuals successfully registered for their National ID, representing 183.62% accomplishment rate of the assigned workload for the month. This strong performance highlights the continued commitment of local authorities and residents to the Philippine Identification System (PhilSys).

An overwhelming majority of those who registered, 85.48%, belonged to the 5 years old and above age group, indicating a broad engagement across the eligible population. Notably, a significant portion, 14.52%, comprised children aged 0-4 years old, reflecting the ongoing efforts to register even the youngest members of the community. In terms of registration channels, Local Government Unit (LGU) fixed registration sites proved to be most

utilized, accounting for 561 registrations or 44.28% of the total. Mall-based registration booths also saw substantial participation, registering 400 individuals or 31.57%. LGU mobile registration teams contributed 212 registrations (16.73%), while the PSA-based registration center facilitated 55 registrations (4.34%). Additionally, outreach efforts through caravans resulted in 39 registrations, representing 3.08% of the total.

The remarkable success in National ID registration for April 2025 in Zambales and Olongapo City underscores the effectiveness of the multi-pronged registration strategy, utilizing fixed sites, mall locations, mobile teams, and outreach initiatives. The high turnout across all age groups demonstrates the widespread recognition of the importance of the National ID. These figures signify a substantial step forward in achieving the goals of the PhilSys program within the region, paving the way for enhanced service delivery and streamlined transactions for its residents.

NATIONAL ID REACHES YOUNGEST CITIZENS IN ZAMBALES & OLONGAPO

Demonstrating a commitment to inclusivity from the earliest stages, the National ID registration efforts in Zambales province and Olongapo City saw a significant number of their youngest residents enrolled in April 2025. Out of the total 1,267 individuals registered during the month, 184 were children aged 0-4 years old, representing a noteworthy 14.52% of the total registrations.

This considerable figure highlights the proactive steps taken to register even infants and toddlers into the Philippine Identification System (PhilSys). While the primary focus of the National ID registration often centers on the eligible adult population, the enrollment of this younger demographic underscores the long-term vision of the program. Registering children at an early age can streamline future access to essential services such as healthcare, education, and social benefits as they grow.

The successful registration of 184 children aged 0-4 in April 2025 in Zambales and Olongapo City reflects the dedication of registration personnel and the willingness of parents and guardians to participate in the PhilSys program for their young ones. This early enrollment contributes to building a comprehensive national registry and ensures that even the youngest citizens are included in this crucial identification system.

OLONGAPO CITY AND SUBIC LEAD NATIONAL ID REGISTRATION DRIVE IN ZAMBALES FOR APRIL 2025

The Philippine Statistics Authority (PSA) Zambales Provincial Statistical Office reported a strong turnout for National ID registration in April 2025, with a total of 1,267 individuals registered across the province and Olongapo City. Spearheading the registration numbers is Olongapo City, which recorded the highest figure with 593 registrants, accounting for a significant 46.80% of the total.



Following closely is the municipality of Subic, which registered 421 individuals, representing 33.23% of the total. San Marcelino contributed 131 registrants (10.34%), while Castillejos recorded 87 registrations (6.87%).

Palauig saw the registration of 35 individuals, making up 2.76% of the total.

The distribution of registration numbers across the municipalities appears to be significantly influenced by the presence of established registration sites. Olongapo City, with its readily accessible Fixed Registration Centers in Kalaklan and Olongapo



City Hall, likely facilitated its high registration volume. Similarly, the municipality of Subic benefited from a Mall-Based Registration booth located in Waltermart Mall, Subic, attracting a substantial number of registrants. The data underscores the importance of accessible and strategically located registration centers in driving participation in the National ID Registration in the province.
