Monthly Inflation Report Keeps Bulacan Informed Month

The Philippine Statistics Authority (PSA) Bulacan presented the province's April 2025 inflation report during its monthly press conference held online on 15 May 2025. The conference was held online via Google Meet and streamed live on social media.

Bulacan's inflation rate rose to 2.2% in April, slightly up from 2.0% in March. The increase was driven by higher prices in Housing, Water, Electricity, Gas and Other Fuels; Health; Alcoholic Beverages and Tobacco; and Recreation, Sport and Culture. Meanwhile, Food and Non-Alcoholic Beverages; Personal Care Miscellaneous Goods and Services; and Transport costs saw a slowdown.

The conference was attended by local officials and stakeholders to help inform decision-making and raise public awareness on price movements and their effects on household spending.

LCRO Random Check and Audit over the Local Civil Registry Offices



PSA Bulacan Conducts Random Check and Audit in Malolos

PSA Bulacan conducted random checks and audits of the Local Civil Registry Offices (LCROs) in the City of Malolos and the Municipality of San Rafael as part of its quality assurance and compliance monitoring efforts.

The MCRO San Rafael audit was led by RO II Christian Winnerin Jose Hilario and RO I Angel Antonio, with support from MCR Mercedes de Vera Rivera and Municipal Administrator Lady Aiza Mapoy.

In CCRO Malolos, the audit team included CSS Elmor Barroquillo, RO II Hilario, RO I Lance De Jesus, SA Jovelle Caparas, and CCR Jocielyn Javier. Ms. Josefina Bernardo represented the City Administrator's Office.

The audit aimed to ensure proper recordkeeping, legal compliance, and identify areas for improvement.

PhilSys Registration Reaches Bedridden Individuals



Registration for the National ID for bedridden individuals

2025, the PhilSys Bulacan team successfully registered 31 bedridden individuals across four barangays in Hagonoy, Bulacanspecifically in Carillo, San Pedro, and Abulalas. The activity also included registrants under the Social Pension program, ensuring that more vulnerable and senior citizens are included in the national ID system. This effort is part of the ongoing commitment to make PhilSys services more accessible to all sectors, especially those with limited mobility.

Bulacan Takes Part in Nationwide Labor Force Survey for 2025 April

The Philippine Statistics Authority (PSA) -Bulacan, in collaboration with the Philippine National Volunteer Service Coordinating Agency (PNVSCA), successfully conducted the May 2025 Labor Force Survey (LFS) with Rider Questions on Volunteer Work from May 8 to 30, 2025.

A total of three Statistical Researchers visited 99 selected households across City of Meycauayan, Hagonoy, Marilao, and Santa Maria. The selected areas ensured a representative distribution of data across the province.



FLEMMS Data Dissemination

FLEMMS 2024 Dissemination Forum

PSA Bulacan joined the Dissemination Forum for the 2024 Functional Literacy, Education, and Mass Media Survey (FLEMMS) held on 30 May 2025. The forum shared key findings on the literacy levels in Central Luzon and Bulacan.

Key findings showed that 92.8% of individuals in Central Luzon and 93.5% in Bulacan have basic literacy skills. Functional literacy was 73.0% for Central Luzon and 72.1% for Bulacan. Women showed higher literacy rates than men: basic literacy was 93.0% for females vs. 92.6% for males, and functional literacy was 75.7% for females vs. 70.4% for males. The data will help guide education planning in the region.

SFGP 2025 Deploys Data Collection Team

The Service Facilities & Government Project (SFGP), conducted from March to May 2025, hired 20 Map Data Collectors (MDC), 4 Team Supervisors (TS), 4 Map Data Processors (MDP), and 2 Map Data Reviewers (MDR) to support its operations.
