PSO Bulacan Holds Tree Planting Activity in Norzagaray to Promote Forests Sustainability

In a strong show of commitment to forests protection and sustainability, the Philippine Statistics Office (PSO) of Bulacan conducted a tree planting activity on June 14, 2025 in Norzagaray, Bulacan, as part of its corporate social responsibility efforts. A total of 100 fruit-bearing trees were planted by the PSO Bulacan staff, led by Chief Statistical Specialist Elmor G. Barroquillo.

The initiative aimed to support ongoing forests conservation efforts while reinforcing the agency's role in community development. Tree planting is widely recognized as a long-term solution to various ecological issues such as climate change, deforestation, and the loss of biodiversity.

PSO Bulacan Joins the 127th Philippine Independence Day Celebration at Historic Barasoain Church

In honor of the nation's rich history and enduring fight for freedom, the Philippine Statistics Authority – Provincial Statistical Office (PSO) of Bulacan participated in this year's Independence Day celebration held at the historic Barasoain Church in Malolos.

With the theme “Kalayaan, Kinabukasan, Kasaysayan,” the event gathered key provincial leaders, including Governor Daniel R. Fernando, Vice Governor Alex C. Castro, heads of line agencies, local officials, and various sectors who came together to pay tribute to the country's journey toward sovereignty.

PSO Bulacan was represented by Registration Officer I David Lance De Jesus and Statistical Analyst Jovelle Caparas, showing support and commitment to commemoration of national history. The program featured a solemn flag-raising, wreath-laying, and messages emphasizing the importance of freedom, unity, and remembering the heroes of the past.

Barasoain Church, known as the cradle of the First Philippine Republic, was a historically significant site for the event.

The PSO Bulacan reaffirms its dedication to nation-building not only through statistics but also by actively participating in significant civic and historical occasions.

Mobile Birth Registration Conducted in Guiguinto, CSJDM, and DRT

The PSO Bulacan, in coordination with several Local Civil Registry Offices, conducted mobile birth registration activities in some areas of Bulacan as part of the Birth Registration Assistance Project.

The mobile registration took place in the City of San Jose del Monte (CSJDM) on June 13 in Barangay Minuyan IV and June 24 in Barangay Santa Cruz I; in the Municipality of Guiguinto on June 26 in Barangay Pulong Gubat and June 27 in Barangay Tabe; and in the Municipality of Doña Remedios Trinidad (DRT) on June 27 in Barangay Sapang Bulak. A total of 147 individuals were successfully registered during the activity—72 in CSJDM, 42 in DRT, and 33 in Guiguinto.

The initiative aimed to assist unregistered individuals in securing their birth certificates by making civil registration services more accessible to the community. It reflects PSO Bulacan's commitment to ensuring that every individual is properly documented and legally recognized.
