Assistant National Statistician Wilma Guillen was also present during the activity since the date and venue of the press conference coincided with the training of the Family Income and Expenditure Survey (FIES) Visit 1 machine processing.

PSA and DILG Spearhead CBMS Stakeholders' Forum



As a preparation for the national roll out of the Community-Based Monitoring System (CBMS) in 2022, the Department of Interior and Local Government (DILG) III and Philippine Statistics Authority Regional Statistical Services Office (PSA-RSSO) III spearheaded a half day CBMS Stakeholder's Forum on 10 September 2021 via video conferencing.

During his opening message, DILG III OIC, RD Jay E. Timbreza encouraged the attendees to partake and support the nationwide conduct of CBMS in 2022. He highlighted that their support is significant to the success of this endeavor.

OIC, SOCD Arlene Z. Torrico provided an overview of the PSA-led CBMS where she emphasized the specific roles of DILG, PSA, and the Local Government Unit (LGU). Meanwhile, PSA RSSO III Senior Statistical Specialist Jennielyn S. Mariano presented the implementation plan of CBMs for the 2022 roll out.

In addition to these, LGOO V Paolo Israel S. Franco discussed the CBMS in the context of full devolution since LGUs are in the process of transitioning into devolution wherein some projects of the national government are delegated to them for implementation.

The half-day activity was participated in by more than 200 participants coming from the different LGUs in Central Luzon, PSA field offices, and representatives from PSA central office. The participants were also given the chance to raise their clarifications and queries during the open forum which were answered by the resource speakers, regional directors from PSA and DILG, and Interim ANS Plenee Grace Castillo.



RSSO III Celebrates CRVS Decade

PSA RSSO III joined the commemoration of the Civil Registration and Vital Statistics (CRVS) Decade every month of August through various activities. Chief Administrative Officer Elna Ruth F. Casasola together with CRASD employees spearheaded series of activities such as Information Dissemination and training on Civil Registrations laws.

Opening Ceremony

This year's commemoration of CRVS Decade in Central Luzon was officially opened through a data dissemination forum on o6 August 2021. CAO Elna Ruth F. Casasola presented the latest results of the vital statistics covering data on birth, death, and marriage. Meanwhile, RO IV Rowena Escoto provided updates on the registration of Phil ID in the region. The half-day activity was attended by staff from Provincial Statistics Offices, City/Municipality Civil Registrar's and representatives from different government agencies.

The invited resource speakers were Mr. Emilio Querubin Jr., Registration Officer IV from the Civil Register Management Division and Mr. Sir Anthony Amad, Registration Officer II from the Legal Instrument Unit of PSA.


CRVS Kahootakan and Closing Ceremony

Pampanga Serbilis Outlet's Overall Satisfaction Rating Spikes Up to 96.6%



Pampanga Serbilis Outlet's Overall Satisfaction Rating of 96.6 percent for September 2021 was higher by 6.6 percentage points compared to 90.0 percent of the same quarter in 2020. The satisfaction rating for "Empleyado" contributed the highest increase from 89.8 percent in September 2020 to 95.6 percent in September 2021. Increases were also registered in "Alituntunin/Karatula" and "Lugar/Pasilidad" from September 2020 to September 2021 with 4.0 percentage points each. On the other hand, the satisfaction rating for "Serbisyo" recorded a decrease from 92.7 percent in September 2020 to 87.7 percent in September 2021.

Furthermore, 65.3 percent of the clients said they were highly satisfied with the "Alintuntunin/Karatula" followed by the "Lugar/Pasilidad" with the second highest highly satisfied 60.7 percent rating. The "Empleyado" and "Serbisyo" recorded 59.6 percent and 42.7 percent highly satisfied ratings, respectively. The "Pangkalahatang Kasiyahan" was recorded to have 59.3 percent highly satisfied rating in September 2021.
